

A Message from Pastor Bob

Guam rails and Guam kingfishers: They cannot go back to Guam because the brown tree snake, accidentally released from New Guinea, took over the island, reaching densities of up to 30,000 snakes per square mile.

Masked bobwhites: They cannot go back to Arizona because their arid grassland habitat has been destroyed by cattle.

California condors: They cannot go back to Southern California because alien invaders are marching across the landscape and gobbling them up, aliens called electricity pylons. (David Wilcove, "Helping the Homeless," Living Lord 13 [Autumn 1994], 8-9.)

Spiritually homeless people: They may not appear to be in need of a home - they have the house, the family, and the neighbors. But, there is a hollow feeling of homesickness that follows them wherever they go.

In these spiritually bankrupt times, many of us have that feeling of homesickness. The welling up of emotions that remind us that our eternal home is with God, but, we are not sure if that eternal home is our destiny.

The cure for spiritual homesickness is the Body of Christ – God's church here on earth. The Body of Christ is capable of propping us up when we are too homesick to stand on our own.

New Testament scholar, John Knox calls the church "the family who remember Jesus." You and I have a family, a church family who remember Jesus even when we cannot remember him.

Bishop Kenneth Carder recently told of some friends losing their 22-year-old son in a tragic automobile accident. "When we gathered in the sanctuary for the funeral service," the bishop said, "we sang some of the great hymns of the church. We affirmed our faith by saying the Apostles' Creed. The choir offered a choral arrangement of Psalm 23. We prayed prayers from our liturgy.

Some weeks following the service, the grieving mother said: "I was too hurt to sing the hymns, and I couldn't say the creed with confidence. But, when I couldn't sing or affirm my faith, the church did it for me. When it seemed that life had fallen apart, the church reminded me that the foundation stands firm."

God's vision for the Church is a foundation that stands firm! It is our vision for the Church – a family of faithful witnesses – a family of support – a family who remembers Jesus.

Let it be so! Amen.


We invite everyone to submit articles and/or information to Jeanne Mowry or Pastor Bob. The deadline for information submission is the 15th of the month prior to publication.

Greenfield United Church of Christ Charge Joint Consistory Meeting Minutes of May 7, 2017

The meeting was called to order by Vice President Barry Barnes. Pastor Bob opened with prayer.

The following members were present:

Sally Barnes, Donna Glass, Robin Pozgar, Roger Knisely, Donna Finnegan, Dick Finnegan, Jonathan Furry, Rick Walter, Scott Finnegan, Sylvia Olewinski, Jeffrey Farber, Louise Smith, Barry Barnes, Karen Stombaugh, Pastor Bob Penner, and Lisa Pejack.

Lisa Pejack read the secretary's report. The report was approved as read.

Rick Walter presented the treasurer's report. Rick reported that the Helsel Christian Education Fund balance is \$7,778.74 as of April 30, 2017. Dick Finnegan moved and Donna Glass seconded the motion to approve the treasurer's report. Motion carried.

Old Business:

The Constitution Committee has not met yet. They will re-schedule a meeting in the next few weeks to discuss needed changes and updates to the language of the current constitution.

Pastor Bob reviewed changes to the 2017 Worship Schedule:

- a. It was proposed that we have no Sunday service during Claysburg Community Days since there is a service in the park that Sunday.
- b. We will celebrate Harvest Home on October 1, 2017 instead of in November.
- c. We will celebrate the 500th Anniversary of the Reformation on November 5, 2017.
- d. On Christmas Eve there will be one morning joint service at Grace.

 Jeff Farber moved and Robin Pozgar seconded the motion to approve these changes.

 Motion carried.

Pastor Bob reported that the job descriptions and contracts for Rick Walter and Robin Pozgar have been completed and are ready to be reviewed and signed by July 1, 2017. The contracts are effective July 1 through December 31, 2017. These will be renewed on January 1, 2018 for the entire 2018 year, and then yearly thereafter. It was also discussed that Wendy Farber should have a contract, as well. Roger Knisely moved and Donna Glass seconded the motion to present contracts to Robin, Rick, and Wendy. Motion carried.

Pastor Bob presented the bids for the replacement of the existing electric hot water heater with a gas indirect-fire water heater using the existing boiler at the parsonage. The proposals are: Knisely's \$3,295.00, Barnes \$3,247.00, and Gardner's \$2,620.00. Sally Barnes moved and Louise Smith seconded the motion to not replace the hot water heater at this time. Motion carried.

New Business/Pastors Concerns:

Rick Walter reported that he will need updated copies of liability insurance for any contractors who do work at each of the three churches to be in compliance with Workers' Comp. Rick

also checked into Workers' Comp insurance rates. Currently our yearly insurance rate from the state is \$1,048.00. We can get the same insurance from DB Mackey of Bellwood for \$766.00 per year. This rate is further reduced to \$686.00 if we choose to have automatic payments. Rick Walter moved and Robin Pozgar seconded the motion to purchase the insurance from DB Mackey. Motion carried.

Pastor Bob will be starting new confirmation classes in September for ages 12-13. These students will be confirmed on Pentecost Sunday 2018.

Penn West Conference is requiring a 3-Way Covenant to be signed by the Minister, the Congregation, and the Juniata Association. After some discussion, Jeffrey Farber moved and Jonathan Furry seconded the motion to not sign this covenant. Motion carried.

The next meeting will be held on July 2, 2017. Jeffrey Farber moved and Dick Finnegan seconded the motion to adjourn the meeting.
